This Leadership Seminar will be facilitated by **Ellen Erlanger and Kathy Meyer**, co-directors of the "Growing Together" Service-Learning Network. "Growing Together" is an education initiative with a strong community impact component. The program's goals are to support significant school improvement and reform, enhance student success, increase the number of civically engaged youth, and address critical local and global issues and needs through the expansion of school-based service-learning.

What: This **graduate course opportunity** will enable interested schools to engage additional teachers in **in-depth and job-embedded professional development** re: service-learning "best practices" and their relationship to excellent teaching.

This interactive course is designed to help teachers more effectively use service-learning, as well as Project Based Learning, 21st Century Skills, career development and character education strategies, to **inspire a "sense of passion and purpose" in their students**. The course will help promote a heightened level of energy and commitment that enables young people to take charge of their learning and lives as they "create their legacies."

Who: Up to 40 educators who have not taken the Level 1 graduate course offered by the "Growing Together" Network will gain the knowledge, skills, and commitment to successfully plan and **implement high quality service-learning projects by the end of the 2016-2017 school year**. Participants will be recruited based on their interest in high quality service-learning, as well as their clear commitment to advancing their professional knowledge and expertise as excellent teachers.

Why: Service-learning works! Research affirms that it **makes a positive difference for kids, teachers, and communities**. High quality service-learning can have a significant impact on **academic achievement, youth development, civic engagement, community-building, and effective problem solving** re: a wide range of local and global issues and needs.

When/Where:

The SL Leadership Seminar: Level 1 will meet **9:00 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. (coffee, etc. available at 8:30 a.m.)**, on **July 25, 26, and 27, 2016**. Four required follow-up sessions will be held—**September 7, October 12, Nov. 9, and Dec. 7 (4:30 p.m. to 7:30 p.m.)** to ensure project continuity and support. All sessions will be held at The Graf Center (Upper Arlington Schools), 2020 Builders Place, Columbus, OH, 43204. Participants will have an **option of 2-3 semester hours of graduate credit through Ashland University or CEUs**.

Participants Will Receive:

This course is an **enhanced version** of our introductory service-learning course "Helping Students Create Their Legacies."
